Pastor's Reflections

This month we continue the season of Easter. Yes, I said "season." The Rev. Joy Borger, Senior Editor at Reformed Worship, reflects on this season. She writes,

"As I reflect on this common pattern of Lent / Holy Week / Easter Sunday / crash, I wonder if our liturgical practices are a bit backwards. After all the energy given to the Lenten journey and Holy Week, Easter bursts forth and then quickly burns out. For the early church, Lent was the time to prepare new believers for baptism on Easter, for their union with Christ in his death and resurrection. Easter wasn't the end of a cycle or journey, but the beginning of fifty days of celebration and ongoing discipleship for all believers, culminating in the celebration of Christ's Ascension.

I can't help wondering what it would look like for us to live more into that rhythm, to place more emphasis on Eastertide, the season of East-

er. How might we focus on discipleship and development of Christian character to help our congregants practice Easter in their daily living?"

She raises some good points. In most churches, including ours, Easter is the season that follows Lent. There is not much fanfare nor does the celebration continue for 50 days as it should. This Easter, I will be providing a sermon series discussing "Christ Appearances." We will look at the ways Christ appears after his resurrection. That alone is cause for celebration.

In this newsletter you will find other ways to celebrate Christ's presence here at First Presbyterian.

Come, celebrate with us! The grace and peace of the risen Christ be with you.

DEACON'S CORNER

Deacon Card Ministry

One of the opportunities the Deacons take on to help members feel welcome and cared about is a card mailing effort. Just as a family member or close friend might consider sending a greeting card for a birthday, a new birth, or perhaps a sympathy note, the Deacons keep an eye on what is happening in the church family.

This is particularly true of those suffering. If someone in the church is going through a tough challenge, healing from an illness, or perhaps recovering from surgery, a Deacon will send an appropriate card. It is felt that a note of prayers and healing, Christian strength, or simply a "Thinking of you" message is the right thing to do. Many of the "Get Well" cards sent in this situation will contain a Biblical passage as well, and all are signed "From the Deacons of the First Presbyterian Church." It is also common for prayers to be offered for these individuals and their families at the close of the monthly Deacon meeting (usually the first Monday of each month).

Another opportunity to offer this mailed "fellowship," is to stay connected to those members that are house or nursing home bound. Birthdays are a good example, and the Deacons keep a list of those members so that a signed birthday card can be sent in a timely fashion.

Church Deacons who have helped fulfill this mailing-style mission in the past include Lynn Rae Olson, Karen Larson, Ronnie Janssen, Kari Ahles, and Betty Vigen. Between 2015 and the present, approximately 550 cards have been mailed out! A note book is kept and passed along to the next person handling these duties. Going through this notebook, it is interesting to note the occasions. In addition to the reasons stated above, occasionally a card will go out with a note of congratulations, recognizing a move into a new home, or perhaps simply "Thank You" to a church member going above and beyond the normal call of fellowship by helping with a church function or event.

Although the Deacons, along with Pastor Darin, try to keep abreast of this opportunity, at times it's entirely possible an event which might warrant a card mailing is overlooked. If you happen to know of someone who could use a positive message of encour-



agement for healing or support, please let a Deacon know or contact one through Camille at the church office.

First Friday Concert



Master guitarist, Mike Dowling, will play in our sanctuary Friday, April 5th. Mike is "a masterful guitarist, with flatpicking, fingerstyle and bottleneck all in his repertoire. . . . It swings, it's jazzy, it's bluesy, it jumps, strides and rags and it reaches right out and grabs you."--Bluegrass Unlimited

Mike grew up in central Wisconsin and early in his self-taught career he caught the ears of jazz violinist Joe Venuti, mandolinist Jethro Burns, and fiddle great Vassar Clements. He toured with Clements in the 70's and recorded with Burns and Venuti in Chicago, taking time off in between jobs to

move to California when he had the opportunity to study with the late, great George Barnes. Barnes had been "the" session guy for many years, recording with everyone from Big Bill Broonzy to Tony Bennett.

In 1994, after years of playing in various ensembles and a decade in Nashville playing sessions, fronting his own band, and writing songs for artists that included Del McCoury, Tim O'Brien, Kathy Mattea, and Emmylou Harris, Mike launched a solo performance career. Armed with an engaging voice, self-deprecating wit and an arsenal of elegant interpretations of old blues, swing, ragtime, and original tunes it didn't take long for Mike to capture the hearts of acoustic music fans and with the release of his first solo album, the critically acclaimed "Swamp Dog Blues", he began headlining at concerts and festivals throughout the world. In 1996, buoyed by his success as a soloist, he packed up his guitars and his fishing gear and moved from Nashville, Tennessee to a little mountain town in northwestern Wyoming.

Performer, composer, instructor, session artist, inventor. Everything guitarist Mike Dowling does reflects his love for and mastery of the instrument that has been the focus of his life for over sixty years.
