Pastor's Reflections

In this month's newsletter insert, you will find the Service Groups list for 2024. Service groups play a vital role in the life of the congregation. They, along with others in the church, offer hospitality to members and friends. In Christine Pohl's book about hospitality, *Making Room: Recovering Hospitality as a Christian Tradition*, the author explores the biblical and historical research regarding hospitality. The central theme is that for most of church history practicing hospitality was central to Christian identity. Yet, some would say, our current generation knows little about this rich, life-giving practice. The author reminds us:

Hospitality is not optional for Christians, nor is it limited to those who are specially gifted for it. It is instead, a necessary practice in the community of faith. One of the key Greek words for hospitality, philoxenia, combines the general word for love or affection for people who are connected by kinship or faith (phileo), and the word for stranger (xenos). Thus etymologically and practically, in the New Testament, hospitality is closely connected to love.

To extend our hospitality beyond worship we provide opportunities for fellowship. We call them Service Groups. These groups serve after worship each Sunday offering hospitality to those who make it downstairs. Specifically, they bring cookies and help serve

throughout the year including helping with the monthly dinner we provide. Below are some questions that have come up over the years.

What if I can't serve anymore?

We realize that not everyone can serve after worship in the kitchen and fellowship hall. But, some may prefer to bring cookies or help out in some other way rather than serving in the kitchen.

If I am the coordinator do I serve every Sunday?

Not at all. You are responsible for lining up servers for your particular month. Please do not think that you are required to do the work by yourself.

Do I need to do everything exactly like it was last week?

No. Service groups vary in form and function and some like to put their own personality on their own service.

I hope you will continue to demonstrate hospitality as you have done over the years. I am grateful for everyone's help with this ministry. The grace and peace of Christ be with you.


